Article 1
APPLIANCE - STORAGE

1060.1.1 Precautionary measures - requirements

No person shall leave, keep or permit upon any land or in or upon any premises occupied by that person or under his or her control, in a place accessible to children, any ice box, refrigerator, freezer, washer, dryer, dishwasher, or similar container not then being used for the purpose for which it was manufactured or produced, without first removing such door or doors and taking such other adequate precautionary measures as may be required to prevent any person from being trapped in such ice box, refrigerator, freezer, washer, dryer, dishwasher, or similar container or in any part thereof.

1060.1.2 Use - purpose - unintended - wholly enclosed building

No person shall use an appliance referred to in Section 1060.1.1 for the purpose for which it is manufactured other than in a wholly enclosed building.

1060.1.3 Exceptions

Sections 1060.1.1 and 1060.1.2 shall not apply where an ice box, refrigerator, freezer, washer, dryer, dishwasher, or similar container:

- (a) is being delivered by a manufacturer of or dealer in such goods; or
- (b) is being stored, or displayed for sale by a manufacturer of or dealer in such goods within a building partly or wholly occupied by or under the control of a dealer or manufacturer; or
- (c) is being exhibited at an agricultural, horticultural, industrial or sporting exhibition or fair;

provided adequate precautions are taken to prevent any person being trapped therein.

Article 2
APPLIANCE - DISPOSAL

1060.2.1 Door - lock - removal - required

No person shall dispose of or abandon upon any land or premises of another in any place accessible to children any ice box, refrigerator, freezer, washer, dryer, dishwasher, or similar container unless all the locks and doors thereon have been first removed. By-law 136-75, 20 October, 1975.

Article 3
ENFORCEMENT

1060.3.1 Fine - for contravention

Every person who contravenes any of the provisions of this Chapter is guilty of an offence and upon conviction is liable to a fine or penalty as provided for in the *Provincial Offences Act*. By-law 226-93, 28 July, 1993.
